





Peabody Energy is the world's largest private-sector coal company serving customers in 25 countries on six continents.








Peabody's Australian platform



- In FY 2018, Peabody's Australian operations produced 36 million tons of coal sold primarily to steel producers and electricity generators in Australia and Asia
- Peabody has mining operations across Qld and NSW directly employing almost 3,000 people
- Qld: North Goonyella, Burton, Millennium, Coppabella Moorvale and Middlemount (50%)
- NSW: Metropolitan, Wambo OC, Wambo UG and Wilpinjong





Growth plans for NSW mines

- IPC, on behalf of NSW Government has approved the United Joint Venture, now awaiting Federal approval under EPBC Act.
- \$381M United Wambo project will be managed by Glencore and produce up to 6Mtpa of saleable coal over a 23-year mine life
 - In 2018 Wambo open cut produced 3.26Mt
- Peabody will continue to operate Wambo underground mine.
- Peabody will spend \$200M over the next 2 years to pursue life extension projects to maintain its export thermal coal volumes at both Wambo and Wilpinjong mines.
 - United Wambo production expected early to mid- 2020
 - Wilpinjong Extension Project (WEP)





Peabody support for Local Suppliers

- In FY 2019 Peabody's NSW mines injected \$558 million in wages and business into local communities throughout NSW.
- Of this, approximately:
 - \$188M from Wilpinjong mine (Mudgee)
 - \$232M from Wambo open-cut and underground (Singleton)
 - \$165M from Metropolitan (Illawarra)
- Local presence of national suppliers (fuel, explosives etc.) add economic activity to the region
- Community support:
 - Wildlife Aid
 - PCYC Singleton Youth Boxing
 - Outstanding Business Awards
 - Newcastle and Hunter Combined Schools ANZAC Service
 - Cystic Fibrosis race day
 - Wambo Singleton Hall of Fame



Peabody leads way with 30-day payment terms

- Company already had almost 95% of supplier spend on 30 days or less payment terms
- November 2018 commitment to bring 100% of SME suppliers onto 30 day terms = approx. 400 suppliers nationally
- Peabody first company to publicly make this commitment
- No geographical boundaries will apply to SMEs offered these terms
