

BACKGROUND OF THE DIALOGUE

- The Dialogue was established in 2011 and followed a series of 2010 community workshops to identify issues
- Four initial themes including Emissions & Health, Land Management, Water Quality and Social Impacts & Infrastructure with projects delivered under each theme
- A 2018 restucture saw all Environment issues brought under the same theme, and new Economic & Social Development, and Communications themes created, in reponse to our second Community Perceptions Survey





CURRENT THEMES AND PRIORITIES

- Environment Managing and minimising air quality impacts; ensuring sustainable and responsible water use; and improving rehabilitation progress.
- Economic and Social Development Continue engagement with Councils and Chambers to improve mining opportunities for local supplier businesses.

- Multi-faceted community stakeholder engagement







ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS: KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Finalising the Analysis of Upper Hunter Air Quality Monitoring Data Project
- Finalising the Upper Hunter Water Quality Analysis Project
- ACARP Pasture Research Dialogue supported study finalised in late 2021
- Continued delivery of annual water use and rehabilitation reporting projects





AIR QUALITY MONITORING DATA ANALYSIS PROJECT

- The Dialogue finalised the initial report in early 2020, following Damon Roddis' (ERM) presentation in 2019.
- Supplementary analysis included 2020 data and found that the wet conditions that year led to a significant improvement in air quality across all monitored regions in the study, including the Upper Hunter.
- Direct correlation between rainfall and particulate matter.





HUNTER RIVER WATER QUALITY (HRSTS) ASSESSMENT- FOLLOW UP ANALYSIS

- A second phase was finalised in 2020, involving further investigation of elevated nitrate levels in mine discharge dams, an action from the initial report.
- The analysis confirmed the relationship between nitrate concentrations and preceding rainfall.
- In periods of higher rainfall (where discharges are permitted), nitrate values are lower than they would be following periods of low rainfall managing discharge concentrations.





ACARP PASTURE RESEARCH

- The Dialogue has supported ACARP research examining past and present mine rehabilitation.
- Follows on from previous study looking at sustainability and profitability of cattle grazing on rehabilitated mine pasture land.
- Pasture Restoration Field Day bringing together agronomists and industry to discuss pasture research and tour pasture rehabilitation in the Hunter.




2022 annual rehab to disturbance ratio






COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Community Perceptions Survey Third survey identified issues and opportunities for the Dialogue to work on.








COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT
